Statutory Leave Date

In Scotland:

- If you turn 16 between 1 March and 30 September you can leave school after 31 May of that year.
- If you turn 16 between 1 October and the end of February you can leave at the start of the Christmas holidays in that school year.
- As a school, we want to support young people into positive post school destinations.

- The Young Person's Guarantee is a commitment to bring together employers, partners and young people.
- It aims to connect every 16 to 24 year old in Scotland to an opportunity.
- This could be a job, apprenticeship, further or higher education, training or volunteering.

College Application Process

- Applications are completed online, through the college directly.
- Young people can apply to as many colleges and as many courses as they wish.
- Most colleges follow a similar process of:
 - Online application
 - Interview
- Guidance Teacher and Careers Advisor will be available from Wednesday 1st February until Wednesday 15th March during period 3, to help support applications in the ICT Suite.
- If young people have Additional Support Needs, colleges have Transition Officers and we will support this in school.



Application Decisions

- Conditional Offer
 - There are qualifications or experiences the young person will need to complete or provide.
- Unconditional Offer
 - The young person already has the required qualifications and experience when submitting their application.
- Unsuccessful Application
- Reserve Place
 - When a course becomes oversubscribed the young person may be offered a place on the reserve list.
 - Apply early to avoid disappointment.

Activity Agreements

- An Activity Agreement is an agreement between a young person and an advisor that the young person will take part in a programme of tailored learning and activity which helps them to become ready for formal learning or employment.
- Helps school leavers gain skills and confidence.
- We are partnered with Services for Young People at Perth and Kinross Council and Logos Youth Project to provide this support..







Activity Agreements

- @Scott Street, Services for Young People is a service which offers guidance, support, information and signposting for young people between 16-20 who are not in education, training or employment.
- Each learning agreement is made involving the young person to ensure any plan is appropriate to their own goals and abilities.
- School can refer young people to this service.





Activity Agreements







Plan A, B, $C \longrightarrow Z$

- It is important to have a back-up plan...or two!
- If apprenticeship is plan A, perhaps college is plan B, with full-time employment being plan C.
- Think outside the box, follow your passions and play to your strengths.







Next Steps for Pupils

- Look up websites and courses.
- Appy to college Wed P3 support available every week.
- Inform Guidance Teacher of intention to apply, where to and what for.
- Regularly check the PSE Microsoft Teams pages.
- Sign up for any relevant opportunities.
- Sign up for open days or events.
- Contact employers directly.
- Ask for support from school staff should it be required.
- Contact Kathleen Davey SDS Careers Advisor.
- It is always easier to get something when you are doing something.



Next Steps for Parents & Carers

- Encourage your young person to regularly check their PSE Microsoft Teams page.
- Support young people to research options.
- Ensure young person has shared information with Guidance Teacher.
- Reach out to school should your young person require support or if you have any questions.
