Staffing update

Principal Teacher of Guidance (Kelty House):

Mr Sam Davidson from George Watson's College in Edinburgh was successful at interview for the PT Guidance role (Kelty House). A highly competitive process with 13 applicants, 8 invited to interview, 4 progressing to stage 2 and Sam unanimously chosen as the preferred candidate by each of the interview panel members.

Mr Davidson has been PT Pupil Support for S1/S2 at George Watson's for 2 years, Assistant PT for 3 years prior, and joins us highly commended from his current school. Given the notice period within the Independent school sector, Mr Davidson will join Crieff High School in early December at the earliest with an exact date still be finalised between the two schools.





Wellbeing and anti-bullying regular update

Wellbeing hub to be launched now that Mental Health ambassadors have been identified and the Principal Teacher with Pupil wellbeing remit has joined Crieff HS.
